YORK CONTAINER COMPANY BUILDS "LARGEST CARDBOARD BOX" BREAKS EXISTING GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS® TITLE

Local company celebrates 60 years of "out of the box" thinking.

NOVEMBER 8, 2014--York, PA-- Employees from York-based York Container Company broke the GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS® existing record for the "Largest Cardboard Box." Employees from across the company worked together to design and build a corrugated cardboard box 80' 4-1/4" x 40' 2" x 13' ½"--large enough to hold 3 tractor trailers.

The record was certified by the official GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS® adjudicator at York Expo Center's Memorial Hall West at 3:00PM. The record-breaking box was on display as part of the company's year-long 60th Anniversary Celebration. Following the award ceremony, more than 200 employees, friends and family sampled recipes from the company's first corporate Chili Cook-off.

"This GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS® attempt has been an exciting part of our 60th anniversary celebration," said Steve Tansey, President and COO, York Container Company. "Our corporate success can largely be attributed to our employees' hard work and creativity. The previous GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS® title for "Largest Cardboard Box" was held by Chegg.com (USA). The box was 6.12 m wide, 14.05 m long and 2.75 m high (20 ft 1.2 in × 46 ft 1.2 in × 9 ft 0.3 in) and was built at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, California, USA, on September 19, 2009. The cardboard box was presented before the NCAA American Football match between UCLA and Kansas State.
